Who was the first that made a sheet of glass, backed with metal, into a perfect reflecting surface? As far as we know, the first mirror-makers lived near the city of Sidon, Lebanon, some 2,400 years ago. Since glass itself likely was invented in Lebanon, it's not too surprising that it was the site of the earliest modern mirrors.

Unfortunately, we do not know the name of the person who first came up with this invention. To make a mirror, pre-Christian Lebanese blew a thin sphere of molten glass into a bubble, and then poured hot lead into the bulb of glass. The lead coated the inside of the glass. When the glass cooled, it was broken and cut into convex pieces of mirror.

These early experiments in the art were not flat, so they must have been a bit like fun-house mirrors. In addition, early glass was generally somewhat bubbly and discolored. Nonetheless, the images would have been much clearer than those **<u>obtained</u>** by looking into a sheet of polished copper or bronze. The blown bubbles of glass used were thin, minimizing the impact of the flaws, so these early glass mirrors were a definite improvement over earlier technologies.

Why is there a shortage of penicillin?

1. In 1928, Scottish scientist Alexander Fleming discovered penicillin by accident. In the following years, it revolutionized medicine helps preventing minor infections from becoming fatal.

2. Overtime, and after repeated exposure to penicillin, bacteria can develop resistance to the drug. This means it stops working. New antibiotics are needed to replace penicillin, but few are being developed. This is because research and development costs greatly surpass the profit generated by them. Boiled potatoes are low in calories and fat, but high in fiber and nutrients. They are naturally rich in vitamins and minerals, particularly potassium, phosphorus, B-complex vitamins, and vitamin C. They are low in calories and fat, and their high fiber content helps you feel full. Contrary to popular belief, potatoes are not inherently fattening. If you add butter or sour cream to potatoes, you increase the numbers of calories and fat grams significantly, so if you are trying to lose weight, season them with herbs or low-calorie condiments.

b. Heart disease takes a lot of lives each year.

When boiled in its skin, a large potato, weighing about 300 grams, has 261 calories, 6 grams of protein, and 0.3 grams of fat. A half-gram of protein can be lost when the potato is peeled before getting boiled, but the calorie and fat contents remain similar. Peeled or unpeeled, the potato has 5 grams of fiber, about the same amount as a bowl of bran flakes cereal, and 3 grams of natural sugar.

However, cooking a potato in water depletes <u>it</u> of some of its nutrients. A baked potato is more nutrient-dense, providing 6 grams of protein and 6 grams of fiber. It has about 25 % more magnesium and 40 % more phosphorus and potassium as a boiled potato.

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Perfect sushi starts with perfect rice. For that you will need a good recipe and some care. Preparing the sushi rice might look complicated and *pedantic* at first, but as you go along with it you might notice that it's just like making ordinary rice, only with rice vinegar added to it, and a bit of Japanese methodology.

There are two simple steps, as follows:

- 1. <u>*Rinse*</u> 3 cups of uncooked rice in a strainer or colander until the water runs clear. Combine with water in a medium saucepan. Bring to a boil, then reduce the heat to low, cover and cook for 20 minutes. Rice should be tender and water should be absorbed. Cool until cool enough to handle.
- 2. In a small saucepan, combine rice vinegar (½ cup), oil, sugar (2 tablespoons), and salt (2 teaspoons). Cook over medium heat until the sugar dissolves. Cool, then stir into the cooked rice. When you pour this into the rice it will seem very wet. Keep stirring and the rice will dry as it cools. Don't put the rice in the fridge to make it cool faster that will damage the rice. You can, however, use a fan or A/C or put it by the window.

Important tip – Some people prefer their sushi rice less seasoned. If it's your first time making sushi rice, and you are not sure, prepare the amount of seasoning described above, but only use half of \underline{it} . Mix it with the rice, and taste. Also, there might be differences in strength and flavour between different brands of rice vinegar.
